

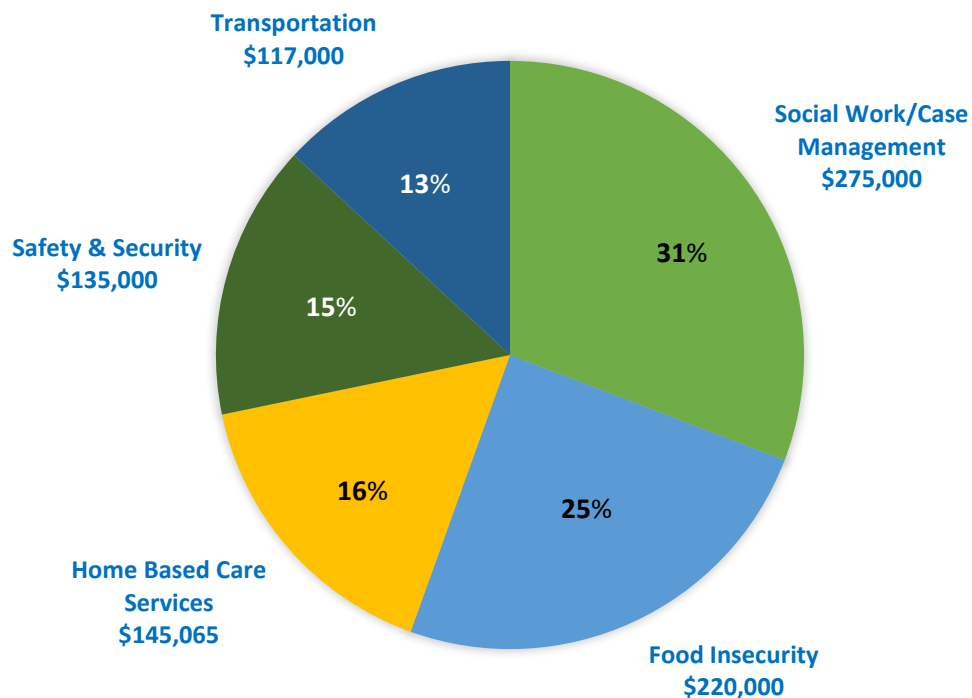


Improving the Lives of Older Adults and Their Caregivers

2022 Grants Report

In 2022, Field Hall Foundation awarded \$892,065 in grants to improve the lives of older adults and their caregivers in Dutchess, Putnam, and Westchester Counties. The 49 grants awarded ranged from \$1,500 to \$50,000.

Overview of 2022 Grants Awarded

Local food pantries were hit two-fold by inflation and rising food, fuel, and utility prices. Most pantries reported serving a record-breaking number of clients in 2022 and realized a dramatic increase in operational costs themselves. The Foundation supported twenty organizations who addressed senior **Food Insecurity**.

Grants for **Home Based Services** focused on a wide range of needs, from providing furniture to low-income seniors to addressing social isolation, vision impairment, mental health, and substance abuse.

Home modifications and repairs, as well as elder abuse programs, were supported through **Safety & Security** grants. A highlight was the grant we provided to Putnam/Northern Westchester Women's Resource Center to support the development of an Elder Abuse Multidisciplinary Team in Putnam County.

The Foundation continues to provide approximately one-third of its support for **Social Work and Case Management** services. Funded programs focused on mental health, healthcare navigation, as well as obtaining food, housing, and other basic needs. Notably, multiple grants were awarded to provide case management services through mobile programs to reach homebound seniors.

Access to transportation continues to be an issue and is especially difficult for seniors. The Foundation's funding for **Transportation** provided support to volunteer senior transportation programs in all three counties, as well as for paid rides when volunteer rides were not available. This allowed seniors the ability to get to their doctor appointments, do errands, go grocery shopping, and participate in social activities.

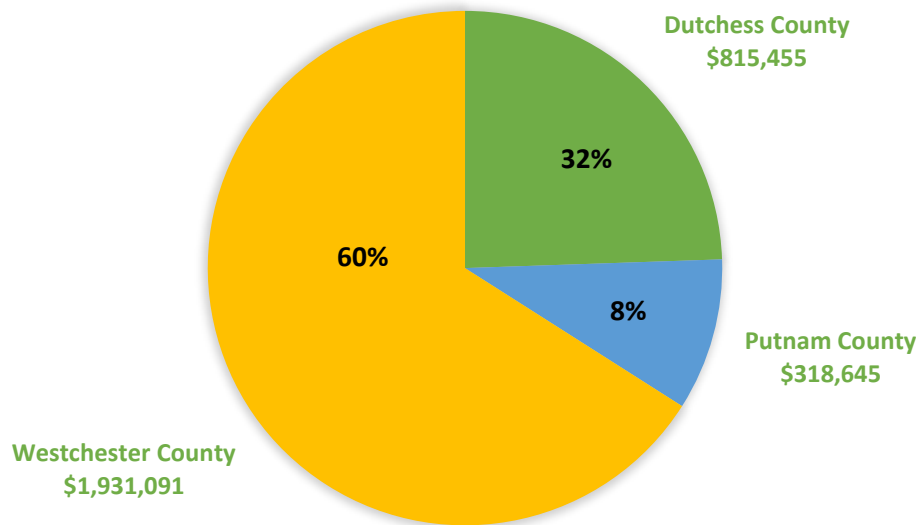
The Foundation did not receive any requests for funding for **Respite Services** in 2022. This focus area is a top priority, and we are committed to supporting these much-needed services in the future.

More Than \$3 Million in Grants Awarded to Date

Since the inception of its grantmaking program in 2019, the Foundation has provided \$3,065,191 in support to nonprofits and government agencies in Dutchess, Putnam, and Westchester Counties.
